## **Key Principles for Looking at Contemporary Art**

- <u>Form Matters</u> -media, materials, size, shape, and scale
  - What artists use and how they relate it to their ideas
  - Presentation and manifestation of work
  - Size and scale
- <u>Ideas Matter</u> ideas are integral to contemporary art and the intent of the artist is crucial
  - The goal is about the critical analysis or exploration of an idea
  - Art often addresses political or social issues
- <u>Context Matters</u> objects can have multiple meanings, so the context in which they are presented matters
  - It was not Marcel Duchamp's "Fountain" that was so controversial, but the fact that he presented it as an object in a museum
  - New ideas in new ways
- <u>Culture Matters</u> artists may not create or engage us in the ways we expect
  - They clarify, complicate, or contradict culture
- Who Matters -it is more difficult to separate the art and the artist
- You Matter the viewer can be intimately involved with the work -literally by participating with the artwork or being engaged through their reaction to the work
